Today, in Singapore Maths, we started our lesson by rote counting from 1-20. We then identified the numerals 1-10. We also practiced counting using concrete items we found in the classroom such as tables, chairs, books and classmates. This was a great way to help the students grasp abstract concepts, such as the association between numbers and objects. We also used finger pictures for counting!

The students enjoyed comparing objects of different sizes! The students were shown a variety of dice that were different sizes; 1 large die and several small ones. The students identified which were bigger and which were smaller. We used the terms “biggest and the smallest”!

The students had a lot of fun with our final activity. Each student was given laminated sheet with printed numbers 1 to 6. Everyone had a turn to roll a die and altogether the class counted the dots and found the corresponding number on their laminated sheets!
